

# Free National Trust Voucher

Visit National Trust online to claim a voucher for a free family pass that can be used on any one day up to Friday 20 October (excluding school half-term, though for most that's after this date).

Free autumn National Trust passes | National Trust



You can get a pass up to 20 October, or until all available passes have been claimed, if that's BURN sooner.

This single-use family pass allows two adults and up to three children, or one adult and up to four children, to visit a National Trust site for free in England, Wales, and Northern Ireland (National Trust Scotland locations aren't included). For this deal, children must be 5-17 years old (under 5s go free). You can also use this as a couple or as a single person. On average, the pass would normally cost £25 to £35.

# If your child is poorly

It is not always easy to decide if your child is too unwell to be off school or could still attend school.


The NHS has provided some guidance to support you in making the decision.

If your child has diarrhoea or is sick, it is important that your child stays away from school until they have not been sick or had diarrhoea for 48 hours.

# **Medicines in school**

Wherever possible, medication should be given at home by parents. If prescribed medicines are to be taken three or more times per day, parents should ask the prescribing doctor if the administration of the medication can occur outside normal school hours. Some nonprescription over the counter medication (such as paracetamol, cough medicines, hay fever eye drops etc) can be administered in school. If your child requires over the counter medication, please ask at the office for further details.



### Food in school

No nuts in school, either in packed lunches or as a snack, please - this is to protect children in school who have nut allergies.

### Uniform

Everyone is looking very smart. Please remember to ensure all uniform is named. The lost property boxes are already full in some phases and most of the uniform that finds its way into the boxes is not named.

Please do not send your child into school with an expensive water bottle. It causes great upset when they are broken or lost. It can also cause upset for families that can't afford them. No jewellery please, including earrings. Plastic earring retainers can be worn whilst recently pierced ears are healing.

### **Operation Encompass and Operation Endeavour**

Northburn continues to be part of the Northumberland County Council and Northumbria Police initiative to ensure effective communication between agencies to safeguard children.

School will be notified if the police are called to a domestic abuse incident so that they communicate, if it is appropriate, with relevant agencies e.g. social services and support children when they are in school. This initiative is referred to as Operation Encompass.

Similarly, the school will be notified if a child is missing from home. This initiative is referred to as Operation Endeavour.



## School Admissions for Year 7 and Reception (2024)

If your child is due to start Reception or Year 7 in September 2024, you can now make an application. The portal for those applying for a **Year 7** place opened on the 12<sup>th</sup> of September and closes on the 31<sup>st</sup> of October. Confirmation of offer of a place will be sent to parents by the Local Authority on 1<sup>st</sup> March 2024.

If your child is in Nursery, and is due to join a **Reception class** in September 2024, the portal will open on the 1<sup>st</sup> of November and close on the 15<sup>th</sup> of January 2024. Confirmation of the offer of a place will be on 15<sup>th</sup> April 2024.

### **Events planned**

It is going to be a busy term with lots of events planned. The P.T.A are organising their annual obstacle event which the children thoroughly enjoy. Year 5 are looking forward to Bikeability and excitement is growing in Year 6 as it's not long until their residential trip to Hawkhirst. I have attached a list of confirmed dates for your diary.
