
Lower Key Stage

What your child will need on their first day back:

- Your child will need to be in their school uniform- all named please. (They do not need to wear a PE kit or bring one into school).
- A named water bottle (not glass).
- A packed lunch unless they are having a school dinner.
- A reading folder- Reception, Year 1 and Year 2.
- A reading folder or small bag (not designer or with a label) Year 3, 4, 5 & 6.

Nursery- you will have been informed about starting and finishing times for your child. Reception doors and KS1 doors open at 8.45 am and again for the end of the day at 3.15. If your child is registered in Class 6 and Class 7 (Primary Specialist Support Base), doors also open at 8:45 am for school to start and 3:15 pm for the end of the day. Information will follow for parents of pupils in Class 6 regarding access to their new classroom. Lower and Upper KS2 doors open at 8.40am.

The school uniform policy can be found on the school website. Please note that earrings and jewellery are not permitted. Please do not send your child into school with expensive PE kits with logos. Also, your child does not need an expensive water bottle that can be lost and damaged. Water bottles should be plastic in case they are accidently dropped.
