Dear Parents

After you have dropped off your child, you can then leave via the gate you used to enter by. This should ease congestion between the Reception playground and the main playground. There will be new signs on Monday to direct you.

If you would like to make a donation, please do so via the Red Nose Day website. The children do not need to bring any money into school. We will not be selling red noses this year.

It is now 10 years since the last national census and we are all being asked to complete one again. I thought it would be interesting for the children to learn a bit about why we have a census. The children will be involved in: counting many things, ideas, opinions and finding out about census day. Next week, they will be given a leaflet to take home.

It continues to be extremely important that you let us know if your child has Covid symptoms, not to send them into school and then arrange for them to have a test. Our procedures have not changed. Twice a week, staff continue to test themselves with Lateral Flow Tests (LFTs).
